The Place:

The Humanities Graduate Student Conference, "Constructing Knowledge Across the Humanities," will take place on the University of Utah campus on Friday, April 4th and Saturday, April 5th, Salt Lake City, Utah. Registration and concurrent panels will be in the Languages and Communication Building (LNCO), 255 Central Campus Drive. (Please refer to online map available at <http://www.map.utah.edu>)

Accommodations:

If you would like to stay in the home of a University of Utah graduate student, contact Rebecca DaPra at r.dapra@utah.edu. Rooms are also available for \$69/night (plus applicable fees and taxes) at the **University of Utah Guest House** at 110 South Fort Douglas Boulevard, which is in walking distance to the conference location. Be sure to mention the Humanities Graduate Student Conference when you make your reservation, and make your arrangements before March 15th. Call 801-587-1000. Additional accommodations can be found at the **University Park Hotel (Marriott)**, 500 South Wakara Way, Salt Lake City for a special rate of \$64/night (plus applicable fees and taxes). Transportation:

Express Shuttle runs a service from the airport to the University of Utah and downtown areas for \$12 (\$6 each additional person). At least 24 hr. advanced notice is required, contact at 800-397-0773. **Public bus** information is available from Utah Transit Authority (UTA) at 801-743-3882 or at <http://www.uta.com>.

Public transportation is available on Friday and Saturday. From downtown Salt Lake City, bus routes 3/103, 4, 13, 14, 52, and 54 travel to "The Business Loop" which is within short walking distance from the conference facilities. **TRAX**, SLC's "subway" system also runs up to the university and is also within short walking distance from the conference facilities.

PRESENTATION INFORMATION

Conference Schedule:

Registration will begin at noon, Friday, April 4th, in the lobby of the Languages and Communication Building (LNCO). Concurrent sessions will follow a brief orientation address and run until 5:30 p.m. Dr. Philippa Levine will give a keynote address at 6 p.m., Friday in the Marriott Library's Gould Auditorium. Saturday will include morning and afternoon concurrent sessions and lunch, free to conference presenters, in LNCO. Dr. James Elkins will follow with a keynote address at 6 p.m. in the Marriott Library's Gould Auditorium. Light refreshments will be served immediately following each keynote.

Presentation Guidelines:

Each presentation will be grouped in panels to encourage interdisciplinary discussion. A moderator will be assigned to oversee each panel and to facilitate a question-and-answer session immediately following the panel's presentations. Your panel's moderator may contact you via e-mail prior to the conference in order to better prepare for his or her role. You will be contacted via e-mail regarding the time, location, and title of your panel. A full conference schedule will be posted on our website after March 10th <http://www.hum.utah.edu/hgc>.

Be sure to limit your presentation to 20 minutes or less (approximately 8-10 pages). Longer projects can be summarized and/or selections can be presented in order to work within this time frame. Please remember that your usage of time will affect subsequent panelists. Requests for overhead projectors, TV/VCR or other technical support should be indicated on your registration form, which is due by March 20th, along with your \$20 registration fee. In some fields, it is common for presenters to receive requests for copies of their work. If you would like to make your work available in this way, consider bringing 5-10 copies. Copy machines are available on Friday, at the University Copy Center, on the ground floor in the Olpin Union (near to LNCO), and Friday or Saturday at the Marriott Library.
